The **Old Tappan Volunteer Fire Dept.** would like to remind all of our residents to assist us by clearing snow and ice from hydrants located near your home. Immediate access to fire hydrants is vital when we are called upon to help you at an emergency scene.

Clogged dryer vents, particularly those in our townhouse developments, pose an imminent threat for Carbon Monoxide poisoning and fire. Please take a moment to inspect your dryer vent and make certain that it is free of lint or other debris.

Extension cords for **holiday decorations** can present fire hazards if not used properly. Please make certain that if extension cords are necessary that they are UL listed and in good condition. Please, Please, Please....make certain that your Christmas tree is thoroughly watered and all dried branches are removed. Consider the placement of your holiday tree and make certain it is not in contact with any heated surfaces. And remember — unattended candles are among the leading causes for house fires in the United States. Please extinguish all **candles** in a room when it is not occupied.

New Laws

Acting Governor Cody signed a law that will **require persons under 17 years of age to wear a helmet** when operating or riding a bicycle, roller skates or a skateboard as of March 1, 2006. Currently, persons under the age of 14 years old are required to wear a helmet when operating this equipment.

Note the **changed speed limits on Cripplebush Road and Washington Avenue from 40 MPH to 35 MPH**. Other roadways being considered for speed reduction are Orangeburg Road and Westwood Avenue.

Police Headquarters (Old and New)

The current building, which was originally constructed as a one-room schoolhouse in the 1920's, is no longer adequate to meet our needs. The new building would be located to the rear and to the side of the present building. By the way, community input is being sought as to how to use the old building once it is no longer occupied by the police. Your suggestions are wanted and needed. Blue Lights Aren't To Be Taken Lightly (pull over to the side of the road and stop)

Volunteer First Responders (Ambulance and Fire) have Blue Light Permits for good reason. And the only thing we ask of you is that you respect the use of that light by immediately yielding, to allow the vehicle displaying a flashing blue light to get by you more easily and have an unobstructed response to their building. **PLEASE PULL OVER TO THE SIDE OF THE ROAD AND STOP.**

As an Old Tappan First Aid Corps member and a CPR and Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) instructor, let me illustrate. Immediate access to the EMS system (calling 911 for help), immediate commencement of Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR), and immediate use of an AED are paramount. Since "911" has already been activated when we get called, let's look at CPR and AED. Adminstrating CPR externally replaces the activity of the lungs and the heart, introducing oxygen to the body and keeping blood (and oxygen) circulating. This delays death until more advanced medical assistance arrives from Paramedics and the hospital. More important, however, is the use of an AED. It is so important that as soon as it arrives, CPR yields to its use. For every minute delay in the use of an AED after a patient collapses, the patient loses about another 10% chance of survival when they otherwise might have survived by a more immediate use. After about 9 minutes, there is no chance of survival with the use of an AED. So **PLEASE PULL OVER TO THE SIDE OF THE ROAD AND STOP.**

In Old Tappan, every police car is equipped with an AED and the police are trained in CPR and AED, but that doesn't detract from the fact that trained EMT's still need to respond rapidly for treatment and transport. So **PLEASE PULL OVER TO THE SIDE OF THE ROAD AND STOP.**

And then there are all those other emergencies, serious trauma, serious bleeding, serious auto accident, accidents and medication mistakes by the elderly, serious allergic reactions, child and infant emergencies, and every other emergency you can imagine. So **PLEASE PULL OVER TO THE SIDE OF THE ROAD AND STOP.**

The Old Tappan First Aid Corps provides CPR and AED training free of charge to anyone of babysitting age and older who lives or works in Old Tappan. For info just call us at 201-666-9030.

FLOOR AREA RATIO ORDINANCE AMENDED

A floor area ratio ordinance is intended to curb the recent proliferation of houses that are so large that they are out of proportion to the rest of the neighborhood. This type of ordinance restricts the size of homes in residential zones by limiting the ratio between the total area of all floors of existing and new buildings or structures as compared to the total area of the property on which the building or structures are located. Limiting inappropriate development has been an important objective set forth in the Borough's Master Plan.

However, after the Mayor and Council adopted a floor area ratio ordinance back in February of this year, there was concern that the ordinance might be more restrictive than had been intended. After reviewing the recommendations of the Planning Board and after careful deliberation, the Mayor and Council adopted Ordinance No. 886RR-05 on November 21, 2005. This eases some of the restrictions in the original ordinance by eliminating the basement and accessory structures from the calculation of floor area in all zones, eliminating two-car garages from the calculation in the RA-10 and RA-15 zones, while decreasing the permitted floor area ratio by 2% in each zone.

The maximum floor area ratio varies depending on the zone in which the property is located and the total area of the property. For example, the maximum floor area ratio for a home in the RA-40 zone on a 40,000 square foot lot is 16%. Accordingly, the maximum permitted floor area for such a structure would be 6,400 square feet (40,000 X .16).
