## Mayor's Message



In my opinion, there is no more critical task for a governing body than the adoption of the budget. Over the past twelve years, the overriding focus of this Mayor and Council has been to fashion a budget which is fiscally prudent within the overall context of managing our community. It is important to remember that the business

of managing the borough is truly a FINANCIAL ONE and must always be looked upon from that perspective. This administration has never, nor will we ever, compromise our long term financial health for short term political gains.

The Borough continues to provide first class services for our residents, while maintaining one of the lowest tax rates in Bergen County. Additionally, this "business first" approach has resulted in a bond rating of Aa3, which is among the highest for municipalities in the Pascack and Northern Valley areas. As long as I am mayor, this council and I will never use long term borrowing to support our day to day operating expenses. That is a recipe for financial Armageddon which would adversely affect your financial investment in this town.

The members of the Borough Council and I worked diligently together, attending numerous budget sessions during the months of January and February. At the beginning of the process, I sent a letter to each department head stating that their operating budget should be reduced if possible over the previous year. We then reviewed every departmental request (including capital items which are needed to maintain our first rate services) and met with the heads of our various departments, boards, committees and commissions. With the assistance of our Chief Financial Officer, Rebecca Overgaard and our Municipal Accountant, Jeff Bliss, we have fashioned a budget for the year 2012 which will yield a Municipal Tax Increase of \$83 THIS YEAR on a home assessed at \$825,552. The schools portion of the appropriation includes a \$116 increase this year for the Elementary/Middle School and a whopping \$404 increase this year from the regional High School, totaling \$603 as an annual increase on a home assessed at \$825,552.

Though the Borough of Old Tappan collects your taxes, the Mayor and Council only control the municipal portion of your overall taxes. The County Budget is adopted by the Freeholders and the Borough is assessed that cost, while the School budget is adopted by the respective Boards of Education, and the Borough is assessed that cost as well. In fact, the County and Municipal portion of your

tax bill over the past years has averaged 27% of your entire tax

bill (approximately 14% is the municipal share), while the School portion has averaged 73% over the same time period for the quality of education our children have been receiving.

Some of the highlights of our current budget are as follows:

- We continue to prudently invest in our DPW, the best personnel
  in the Valley, by providing them with the tools and equipment
  they need when the going gets rough. We are purchasing a multi
  use truck with components that will make it a year round vehicle,
  a pickup truck and a flat bed, while also looking to purchase a
  sweeper within the next two years as the current one has run its
  useful life.
- Public Safety is extremely critical to this administration and our police force is the centerpiece for this town. With various retirements having occurred and anticipated, we have hired one police officer and will hire two more over the next twelve months to bring our total back to where we were three years ago. Additionally, we have and continue to enjoy, a superb relationship with River Vale for dispatching. Our partnership with River Vale is solid and no change in dispatching will take place without their support and the full vetting of our stakeholders. The rush to county dispatching, so prevalent in the papers and by our county executive, needs to be fully scrutinized before a decision is made as to it, and more importantly, Old Tappan's viability of success. I have always felt that local governments, particularly this one, manages the borough's finances rather well in comparison to what has gone on at the county level. Stay tuned.
- We have finalized a three year program for road resurfacing. We all know, see and feel the potholes as we drive through town. Recognize that there are some things which we can handle ourselves, and do, and others that we need county assistance with. Our sidewalk program, funded with Federal dollars, will continue. We will finish all of Orangeburg Road and Old Tappan Road near the center of town. Finally, the County is in the process of installing ADA compliant curbs and then the entire length of Westwood Avenue will be repaved.

Your Mayor and Council are, to a person, dedicated to getting the most out of your tax dollars. You will continue to see the results of our efforts in 2012. Over the past 12 years, this administration has clearly shown a pattern of fiscal responsibility and concern for our collective financial futures. We believe in and are committed to bettering Old Tappan through sound planning and prudent investment in our infrastructure, with specific emphasis on the present and future well-being of this town. As we have shown, we will not enter into agreements which are 'politically feasible." That is not nor has it ever, been our game. Yet, we will continue to work to find new ways of sharing services and doing more, with less. As you know, I believe that small communities not only govern better, but in the end are far more fiscally prudent than they are made out to be. Old Tappan continues to be the exception, not the rule.

#### Tax Collector's Office...

**Property taxes** are due 8/1/12. There is a 10 day grace period until 8/10/12.

\*\*\*If the 2012 tax bills are not sent out on time because the tax rate has not be struck by the County you will be notified of the new due date.

Sewer User fee is due 9/1/12. There is a 10 day grace period to 9/10/12. A NEW BILL FOR 9/1/12 WILL NOT BE SENT. THE BILL SENT IN FEBRUARY IS FOR THE ENTIRE YEAR.

Current Year (2011) Property Tax Reimbursement. Under the terms of the proposed State Budget for FY 2013, which must be adopted by July 1, 2012, only those applicants whose income for 2010 did not exceed \$80,000 and whose income for 2011 did not exceed \$70,000 (the original limit was \$80,000) would be eligible to receive reimbursements for 2011 provided they met all the other program requirements. While residents whose 2010 income did not exceed \$80,000 and whose 2011 income was over \$70,000 but not over \$80,000 would not receive reimbursements for 2011, even if they met all the other program requirements, by filing an application they can establish their eligibility for benefits in future years. If this budget proposal is adopted, the Division of Taxation will send notices to applicants whose 2011 income was over \$70,000 but not over \$80,000 advising them that they are not eligible to receive reimbursement payments for 2011.

All property tax relief program information provided here is based on current law and is subject to change.



The Old Tappan Municipal Alliance has been working diligently this year on scheduling and coordinating programs for the residents of Old Tappan regarding the dangers of substance abuse. The Alliance Committee is comprised of community members who develop the goals and objectives of the Alliance in our town. #### **DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS...**

We have recently been having a problem with objects in the sanitary sewer system that do not belong there. We have had the following; items of clothing, mop heads, cleaning cloths, "Swiffer" style cleaning cloths, and rocks. These items have jammed and clogged pumps, requiring the removal and disassembly of pumps from 4 different pumping stations. This is a costly and time consuming situation that should be unnecessary, it could require the replacement of a pump costing \$7000 or more. Disposing of such items is a violation of borough ordinance §198-5. You also chance causing a back up in your lateral or in the street main outside your house which then could have sewerage backing up into your basement. We would also like to remind you that it is also a violation to dump cooking grease and oils down the drain as well as the connection of sump pumps and gutters to the sanitary sewer system.

#### **Clean Out and Dispose of Your Old Medications**

At least once a year, you should check the labels on all of your medications. Medications that are past their expiration date, that have a change in color, smell, texture, or medicines that you are no longer taking should be disposed of properly. Expired medications may not work as well for you, or may even be harmful. **Do not flush drugs down the toilet.** Studies show that pharmaceutical waste is now present in our drinking water and harms our environment. Unfortunately, there are no waste treatment plants in the United States that are engineered to remove drugs from sewage. Again, **do not flush drugs down the toilet.** Pharmacies and county hazardous waste agencies sponsor take back programs where you can bring unused medication.

#### **OLD TAPPAN KICKS OFF LINE DANCE CLASS**




