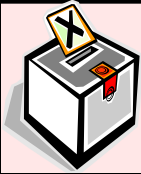


THE ENVIRONMENTAL COMMISSION...

SPECIAL GENERAL ELECTION FOR U.S. SENATE:

Wednesday, October 16th – 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.

Last day to register to vote in the Special General Election is Wednesday, September 25th. The Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Wednesday, September 25th until 9:00 p.m.

GENERAL ELECTION:

Tuesday, November 5th – 6:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.

Last day to register to vote in the General Election is Tuesday, October 15th. The Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tuesday, October 15th until 9:00 p.m.

The Bergen County Board of Elections issues voter Registration Cards.

If you are going to be out of town on Election Day, you may pick up an application for a mail-in ballot at the Municipal Clerk's Office. The **County Clerk** must receive applications by mail no later than 7 days prior to Election Day. **After the 7 day deadline all applications must be hand delivered to the County Clerk no later than 3:00pm the day before the election.**

DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES: Watch for your Sample Ballot, which indicates your District and Polling Place in the left hand corner. Contact the Municipal Clerk's office at 201-664-1849 ext. 14 if you have any questions.

Property Taxes are due 11/1/13. There is a 10 day grace period until Tuesday 11/12/13 (the 10th is a Sunday and Borough Hall is closed on Monday the 11th for Veteran's Day Observance)

Sewer User fee is due 9/1/13. There is a 10 day grace period until 9/10/13.

Annual Special Benefit Assessment bills have been mailed. There are various due dates so check your bill for your due date.

Do we have your correct mailing address: Many tax bills as well as other important notices from the Tax Collector are returned by the Post Office as undeliverable. Property owners often neglect advising our office that their mailing address has changed. Please help us to keep our records up to date. Requests to change mailing address must be submitted in writing. Please look for the form on the www.borougholdtappan.net.

Online bill pay from your bank: Please be aware payments that you initiate with your own bank through online bill pay should be scheduled in advance of any due date to allow a sufficient number of mailing days for the Borough to receive, process and apply the payment to your account. Payments from online bill pay are sent through the mail. We do not accept electronic payment for taxes. All payments must be received by 4pm on the 10th day of the grace period. The Borough is not responsible for late payments due to delays in mail service or bank processing.

State Administered Annual Deductions on Property Taxes:

Current Year (2011) Homestead Benefit. Most eligible homeowners will receive their 2011 homestead benefit as a credit applied to property tax bills in **August 2013**. Those homeowners who either sold their home prior to filing the homestead benefit application, or whose principal residence was a unit in a co-op or continuing care retirement community will be issued a benefit in the form of a check or direct deposit in August 2013. Tenants will not receive a 2011 rebate. The deadline for filing 2011 applications was December 14, 2012.

2012 Homestead Benefit: Applications for the 2012 homestead benefit are expected to be mailed in the fall of 2013.

Changes to the Property Tax Reimbursement Program (Senior Freeze)

Filing deadline for 2012 Senior Freeze (PTR) Applications extended to September 16, 2013. Under the terms of the proposed State Budget for FY 2014, was adopted July 1, 2013, only those applicants whose income for 2011 did not exceed \$80,000 and whose income for 2012 did not exceed \$70,000 (the original limit was \$82,880) would be eligible to receive reimbursements for 2012 provided they met all the other program requirements. While residents whose 2011 income did not exceed \$80,000 and whose 2012 income was over \$70,000 but not over \$82,880 would not receive reimbursements for 2012, even if they met all the other program requirements, by filing an application they can establish their eligibility for benefits in future years. If this budget proposal is adopted, the Division of Taxation will send notices to applicants whose 2012 income was over \$70,000 but not over \$82,880 advising them that they are not eligible to receive reimbursement payments for 2012.

Note: The format of the 2012 property tax reimbursement application has changed. Applicants must complete the entire application and sign on the last page. Read all instructions carefully. The method of reporting pension and retirement benefits (including IRA and annuity income) for property tax reimbursement purposes has changed as a result of a recent court decision.

2011 Property Tax Reimbursement. Under the terms of the State Budget for FY 2013, only those applicants whose income for 2010 did not exceed \$80,000 and whose income for 2011 did not exceed \$70,000 (the original limit was \$80,000) were eligible to receive reimbursements for 2011 provided they met all the other program requirements. The Division of Taxation sent notices to applicants whose 2011 income was over \$70,000 but not over \$80,000 advising them that they were not eligible to receive reimbursement payments for 2011.

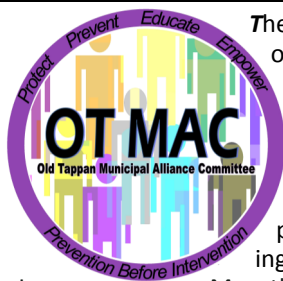
Residents whose 2011 income was over \$70,000 but not over \$80,000 did not receive reimbursements for 2011, even if they met all the other program requirements. However, by filing a 2011 application by the due date, these residents established their eligibility for benefits in future years.

Eligibility requirements, including income limits, and benefits available under this program are subject to change by the State Budget.

Local Annual Deductions on Property Taxes:

Senior Citizens: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowner's age 65 or older or disabled who meet certain income and residency requirements.

Veteran Deduction: Annual property tax deduction of \$250 for homeowners who are qualified war veterans and their surviving spouses. Please inquire at the tax office about these property tax deductions.

BOARD OF HEALTH...

Attention Baby Boomers! The United States Preventive Service Task Force just announced that all Baby Boomers should be tested for hepatitis C. An estimated 15,000 Americans die each year from the consequences of hepatitis C infection, which can cause liver scarring, liver failure, and liver cancer, although such effects typically do not show up for decades, if at all. About three-quarters of the more than three million Americans with hepatitis C are Baby Boomers born between 1945 and 1965, but most do not know it because they have no symptoms. Those at highest risk include users of injected drugs and recipients of blood transfusions before 1992, when screening of donated blood for the virus began. New drugs have increased the cure rates for hepatitis C when used along with existing drugs. Other pharmaceutical companies are racing to bring drugs to the market.
