A Message from Mayor Polce



Having spent twenty five years on Wall Street, I have long felt that Old Tappan had the ability to attain the highest debt rating for general obligation bonds not only in the county, but throughout the state. Just this past December, Standard and Poor's rating agency upgraded Old Tappan's bonds to AAA, the highest rating available. In fact, I believe that we are one of six towns throughout Bergen County that currently enjoys this prestigious rating. This rating affords Old Tappan the opportunity to borrow at the lowest interest rate available at that time. For Old Tappan taxpayers, this is great news. I am sure that our erstwhile President in the White House, Barack Obama, wishes that our government had a similar

debt rating. As the United States has \$17 trillion in debt, we need the lowest rates possible to be able to service this debt as cheaply as possible.

Some of the comments from the Standard and Poor's report are as follows:

- We consider Old Tappan's economy to be very strong.
- The Borough's budgetary performance has been very strong throughout the years.
- Old Tappan has a strong balance sheet and liquidity is abundant. And the one that I am most proud of is the next one..
- We view the Borough's management conditions as strong with good financial practices.

I would like to thank all members of the Council for their careful planning and extraordinary work, year in and year out, in crafting budgets and capital expenditures which made sense while being fiscally prudent. A special thanks also goes to our CFO, Becky Overgaard for her work and our borough administrator, Pat O'Brien, for adhering to our best practices philosophy. In the end, this is the essence of good leadership and even better, teamwork.

That being said, there is absolutely no question that we continue to live through difficult times, full of uncertainty. In the fourteen years that I have been privileged to serve as Mayor of this great town, these past several years have presented the greatest of challenges. We will continue however, to use our corporate model which has served us rather well since 2000, to determine the financial needs of the borough while producing a budget that supplies the services we as a community need to maintain a fiscal budget that is both responsible, yet conservative.

As you all know, the Borough portion of your budget is 15% of the overall budget and therefore only 15 cents on your tax dollar. One cent goes to the Open Space Trust Fund, thirteen cents is for County taxes while seventy one cents goes to support our schools. As you can see, we have no direct control over 84% of your budget. With our fifteen cents, we support the agencies of the Borough such as Police, Fire, DPW, Ambulance Corp, Library, Recreation Commission, Senior Programs and all Administration aspects of the Borough. We always make sure that we give them the tools they need to do their jobs effectively and in a timely fashion, while providing our residents with the best in class services that they've come to expect.

Although there will be many challenges over the next twelve months, we need to always place them in the context of the opportunities they present. Please know that this Mayor and Council stands ready to work with you every step of the way, and every single day. On behalf of the members of the Council, our borough family and myself, thank you for the opportunity to work on your behalf. It is a responsibility that we take very seriously.

PRIMARY ELECTION: Tuesday, June 3rd 6am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the Primary Election is Tue., May 13th. The Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., May 13th until 9pm

GENERAL ELECTION: Tuesday, Nov. 4th 6:am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the General Election is Tue., October 14th. Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., Oct. 14th until 9 pm.

The Bergen County Board of Elections issues voter Registration Cards.

If you are going to be out of town on Election Day, you may pick up an absentee ballot application at the Borough Clerk's Office. The <u>County Clerk</u> must receive applications by mail no later than 7 days prior to Election Day. <u>After the 7 day deadline all applications must be hand delivered to the County Clerk no later then 3pm the day before the election</u>.

DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES: Watch for your Sample Ballot, which indicates your District and Polling Place in the left hand corner. Contact the Municipal Clerks office at 201-664-1849 ext. 14 if you have any questions.

POLLING PLACE FOR DISTRICTS 1, 2, & 3: Charles DeWolf Middle School Gym, 275 Old Tappan Road

Property Taxes are due 5/1/14. There is a 10 day grace period extended to 5/12/13 since the 10th lands on a Saturday.

Current Year (2012) Homestead Benefit. Filing deadline was extended to January 31, 2014.

Sewer flow fee due 3/1/14. There is a 10 day grace period until 3/10/14. Bills were mailed in the beginning of February for both payment periods 3/1 and 9/1. Both periods may be paid at one time. Separate bills will be issued for those homeowners who have an annual Special Assessment bill for sewer installation.

Amounts received under the Homestead Benefit Program are in addition to the State's other property tax relief programs. The total of all property tax relief benefits received (homestead benefit, property tax reimbursement, property tax deduction for senior citizens/disabled persons, and property tax deduction for veterans) cannot exceed the amount of property taxes paid on your principal residence for the same year.

If you receive a benefit that is larger than the amount for which you are eligible, you must repay any excess received. The Division can deduct the amount owed from your homestead benefit or income tax refund or credit before the payment is issued.

Note: Eligibility requirements and benefit amounts will not be finalized until the completion of the State Budget, which must be adopted by July 1, 2014. Additional information on the 2012 homestead benefit will be posted when it becomes available. Most homeowners will receive a 2012 homestead benefit as a credit on a future property tax bill.

Rockland Electric Company System Upgrades

On December 19th, representatives of Orange & Rockland presented their 5 year, 5 million dollar plan for improvements and expansion to their facilities

here in Old Tappan. In attendance was our DPW Superintendent, Artie Lake, Borough Engineer, Tom Skrable, Borough Administrator, Pat O'Brien, Councilman Guy Carnazza and Councilman John Kramer. Below is a short synopsis of the presentation in an effort to keep Old Tappan apprised of any developments. These improvements are planned in three phases:

Phase I; involves the dividing of a high power loop system that serves a number of towns, into 5 sections. This division will enable the company to maintain service to a greater number of customers while isolating sections where outages have occurred. Phase II; will involve upgrades to the Haring corner's substation located on Orangeburg Road north in the vicinity of the Village. Additionally, Phase II will provide for underground transmission lines encased in concrete which will be installed along the company's rights of way.

Finally Phase III: involves the construction of a second sub-station on vacant land owned by the company in the vicinity of property which lies between the ends of both Continental Drive and Orchard Lane. Phase III will require Old Tappan Planning Board review and site plan review as a courtesy, all of the upgrades are on Orange and Rockland Electric property or are within the company's rights of way.

The borough will continue to keep you informed as the project proceeds posting information on the borough website and in the borough newsletter.

KUDZU INVASION...

Yes. "invasion" is the right word. Native to Asia, this inva-

sive vine, growing up to one foot per day, was imported to the southeastern United States decades ago as a means to control soil erosion on barren ground. The vine is so prolific however that it has spread up the east coast and has now reached Old Tappan. The problem: this vine grows so quickly that within a year, it can completely engulf your trees and shrubs. Kudzu leaves outcompete our native trees and shrubs of essential sunlight, weakening the host plant until it eventually dies. This is both an environmental and economic issue.

Old Tappan residents and businesses must be pro-active. While you enjoy your yards this spring and summer, be on the look-out for Kudzu. And when you find it, pull the plant out from its roots. If that proves too difficult a task, cut the stem where it emerges from the ground and be vigilant to re-cut the vine during each month of growing season. It is important to keep the vine in check. Also notify your neighbors so Kudzu does not gain a foothold in those less-maintained areas between properties or along fence lines. REMINDERS FROM THE DPW & BUILDING DEPARTMENT..... **WOOD MULCH & LEAF COMPOST**

The Department of Public Works will deliver wood mulch and leaf compost free of charge to residents. Please fill out the appropriate form at the Borough Hall to arrange for delivery (a new form is required for each delivery). Orders will be accepted after April 15th and deliveries may not begin before May 15th. No deliveries after August 1.

BRANCH CHIPPING

Beginning April 16th the DPW will chip branches that residents have trimmed from their trees (if you hire someone to do the trimming they are responsible to dispose of the debris). We will do the west side of town (Central Ave. to River Vale) on the Wednesdays, and the east side of town (Central Ave. to the state line, including Central Ave.) on the 2nd & 4th Wednesdays.

Please stack branches at the curb with the cut ends facing out, maximum 4 inch diameter, do not place in the street and do not block a sidewalk. The only items you may place for pickup in the street are leaves during fall leaf season. The last scheduled branch chipping day will be October 8th on both sides of town, there will be NO chipping during leaf pick pickup.

RECYCLING CENTER

The recycling center located at the Public Works Garage on Russell Avenue is open from 7:00am to 3:00pm weekdays and 10:00am to 1:00pm on Saturdays (closed holidays). Only those items designated for recycling are accepted, please place items in the appropriate designated container, please do not place plastic bags in with recyclables. In addition those items picked up curbside the center accepts cardboard (flattened), used motor oil, car tires and used clothing as well as computers & electronics.

Please use the curbside pickup whenever possible to prevent an overflow situation at the recycling center.

We have already experienced some significant snowfall for the beginning of this year, and our resident's assistance regarding snow removal is greatly appreciated. Police, Fire and Ambulance personnel look for swift and safe access to homes and properties in the event of an emer-

gency. Clearing driveways and sidewalks of snow, ice and other debris enhance our ability to help residents in their time of need.

The OTPD would like to remind all motorists to exercise caution in and around the area of our schools especially during the time of opening, and the dismissal of students. Please be aware of the presence of our School Crossing Guards and their very important role for keeping the students safe. Residents are reminded that Borough Ordinance 242-2D prohibiting overnight parking from 2 am to 6 am is in effect from November 15th to April 1st.

The Prom and Graduation time of year is not that far away. Parents and residents are reminded that underage drinking is against the law. State Law and Borough Ordinance prohibit underage alcohol consumption on public and private property. Liability issues should be seriously considered by property owners and residents with regard to allowing the underage consumption of alcoholic beverages within their homes. The OTPD has continued to distribute yellow Courtesy Security Awareness cards to select homes. While on patrol in your neighborhood, an Officer may have noticed a condition that might pose a threat to your safety and property. 


