The Borough of Old Tappan still has the second lowest municipal tax rate while continuing to provide best in class services to all our residents. The OT First Aid Corps has been making some excellent progress in implementing new strategies to attract new members while servicing the emergency needs of our town's citizens To that end we are upgrading our facilities and identifying ways to reduce time volunteers have to dedicate. Our daytime crews are as busy as ever. Most Corps members dedicate only one night per week and the First Aid Corps is able to cover all of our town's needs. With a

Important Information For the 2014 Elections

PRIMARY ELECTION: Tuesday, June 3rd 6am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the Primary Election is Tue., May 13th. The Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., May 13th until 9pm

GENERAL ELECTION: Tuesday, Nov. 4th 6am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the General Election is Tue., October 1st. Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., Oct. 14th until 9 pm. The Bergen County Board of Elections issues voter Registration Cards.

If you are going to be out of town on Election Day, you may pick up an absentee ballot application at the Borough Clerk's Office. The <u>County Clerk</u> must receive applications by mail no later than 7 days prior to Election Day. <u>After the 7 day deadline all applications must be hand delivered to the County</u> <u>Clerk no later then 3pm the day before the election</u>.

DISTRICTS AND POLLING PLACES: Watch for your Sample Ballot, which indicates your District and Polling Place in the left hand corner. Contact the Municipal Clerks office at 201-664-1849 ext. 14 if you have any questions.

POLLING PLACE FOR DISTRICTS 1, 2, & 3: Charles DeWolf Middle School Gymnasium, 275 Old Tappan Road

Property taxes are due 8/1/14 unless we do not have a certified tax rate by then. There is a 10 day grace period until 8/11/14.

***If the 2014 tax bills are not sent out on time because the tax rate has not be struck by the County of Bergen you will be notified of the new due date.

Sewer User fee is due 9/1/14. There is a 10 day grace period to 9/10/14. A NEW BILL FOR 9/1/14 WILL NOT BE SENT. THE BILL SENT IN FEBRUARY IS FOR THE ENTIRE YEAR.

Changes to the Property Tax Reimbursement Program

(Senior Freeze)

Eligibility requirements, including income limits, and benefits available under this program are subject to change by the State Budget.

2013 Property Tax Reimbursement. Any changes to the eligibility requirements and benefit amounts for 2013 property tax reimbursements will not be finalized until the completion of the State Budget that must be adopted by July 1, 2014. This means that the requirements for a 2013 reimbursement, including the income limits, may be changed by the State Budget. Updated information on changes to the Senior Freeze Program for 2013 will be posted as it becomes available.

Note: For 2012 the State Budget limited reimbursement payments to certain applicants. Only those applicants whose 2011 income did not exceed \$80,000 and whose 2012 income did not exceed \$70,000 (the original limit was \$82,880) were eligible to receive reimbursement payments for 2012, provided they met all the other program requirements. The State Budget may apply similar limitations for 2013. **Homestead Benefit Program**

Current Year (2012) Homestead Benefit. The filing deadline for 2012 Homestead Benefit Applications was January 31, 2014. Eligibility requirements and benefit amounts will not be finalized until the completion of the State Budget, which must be adopted by July 1, 2014. Additional information on the 2012 homestead benefit will be posted when it becomes available.

The River Vale Police Department is a designated permanent site for the disposal of unused, unwanted, and expired prescription drugs. People should never flush pills down the toilet or sink

because they eventually end up in our water supply. "Project Medicine Drop" is available to all consumers in NJ and the drop-off sites allow the individual to safely, securely and anonymously dispose of their medications 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. There are 30 such sites located in the state so spread the word to family and friends. We urge you to take advantage of this important service. The program can accept only solid medications such as pills, patches, inhalers and similar objects. The boxes cannot accept liquids, medical waste, or syringes.

Both of these roads are owned and maintained by the County of Bergen and any improvements fall under its jurisdiction. We hope that their study will agree with our assessment and that a much needed traffic light will be installed.

place. The Old Tappan business districts, school fields, parks and recreational facilities become busy places. The Old Tappan Police Department would like to remind everyone using and traveling in the area of these facilities to exercise caution and be safe. Please be aware of pedestrians walking in parking lots and crossing the streets leading to these business and recreational areas. Drivers are encouraged to reduce their speed in and around the properties used for these purposes. Complaints of speeding vehicles and distracted driving appear to be the most frequent violations reported around the residential streets of our community. In many instances, the drivers are our own neighbors. Kindly make every effort to comply with the 25MPH speed limit and parking regulations in all residential areas, and reduce your speed especially near our schools, and recreational areas. The OTPD would like to remind all motorists to exercise caution in and around the area of our schools especially during the time of opening, and the dismissal of students. Please be aware of the presence of our School Crossing Guards and their very important role for keeping the students safe. Residents are reminded that Borough Ordinance 242-2D prohibiting overnight parking from 2 am to 6 am is not in effect from April 1st to November 15th and overnight parking on residential

streets is permitted unless otherwise posted. The Prom and Graduation time of year is upon us. Parents and residents are reminded that underage drinking is against the law. State Law and Borough Ordinance prohibit underage alcohol consumption on public and private property. Liability issues should be seriously considered by property owners and residents with regard to allowing the underage consumption of alcoholic beverages within their homes. Also, it is unlawful in the State of New Jersey to use or possess fireworks without being licensed to do so. The Old Tappan Police Department wishes all resi-

dents to have a safe and healthy sum-

mer, and encourages our residents to be alert with regard to the safety of our community. Please join with us in making Old Tappan a safer and secure place to live. The OTPD appreciates everyone's assistance in helping us, help you.

SENIOR CENTER OPENS...

The Senior Advisory Committee had the honor of holding the very first meeting to be held at the newly opened senior center located at 247 Old Tappan Road on Thursday afternoon April 17, 2014. The newly renovated building was constructed in 1927 as a one room schoolhouse. Since 1940 the building went on to serve as a borough hall, municipal court, a scout meeting place, and finally as a police headquarters. Upon the police moving to their new facility, the building became slated for renovation and designed for the exclusive use of our senior residents for meetings and social functions.

The recent renovation consists of the installation of new bathrooms, a kitchen, an elevator, a newly designed rear entrance, and a 28' x 35' open meeting room. The lower level hosts a conference room, fully equipped computer stations, a mini-kitchen, a bathroom, and number of



storage closets. Construction wise the building has new ceilings, stairs, heating and air conditioning systems, and is smart-wired. Roughly three guarters of the financing was afforded through a grant in the amount of \$290,347.00 obtained from the Bergen County Community **Development Program.**



Use of this building is solely dedicated for seniors. The Senior Advisory Committee, a group of twelve residents appointed by the mayor and council, host various functions for seniors and oversee the activities and use of the facility. The newly formed Senior Social Society, open to all residents, formerly known as the Golden Age Club, is now organized under the auspicies of the borough. The firehouse meeting room, which is used by many organizations, will continue to be available for larger senior functions.

Thanks go out to committee members, council members, our architect, our administrator, and to the many who brought this project to fruition. Respectfully submitted by Councilman John Kramer

ENVIRONMENTAL UPDATE...

 ${\it T}$ he Borough is once again looking forward to another year as a Sustainable Jersey Community. Here are a few ways we can help each other.

The annual Paper Shredding event will be October 18, 2014 from 9 AM to 1PM at the DPW on Russell Ave. However there are many shredding events throughout the year and you can access www.bcua.org to get information when other shredding days are being held throughout the County. This is a great way to recycle and insure that your documents are destroyed and no one can have access to your private information. The documents are shred right in front of you.

While at the www,bcua.org site you will find a great deal of helpful information including complete information regarding recycling of household hazardous waste, electronics and tires. These events are open to all Bergen County residents and are free of charge. You may be asked for identification.



The Borough also supports the Anti Idling Laws of the State of New Jersey. Signs will be posted in several locations reminding us that idling of more than three minutes is not permitted and is in fact against the law. Did you know you use more gas in ten seconds than you use to start your car? So let's shut down the

engine and enjoy the fresh air. "A gasoline-fueled motor vehicle is not allowed to operate for more than three consecutive minutes when the vehicle is not in motion, with the following exceptions: 1) a vehicle stopped in a line of traffic; 2) a vehicle being inspected by a state or federal motor vehicle inspector; 3) an emergency vehicle operating in an emergency situation; 4) a vehicle being repaired or serviced; 5) a vehicle whose primary power source is used for a me-

chanical operation other than propulsion; and 6) a vehicle parked in a non-residentially zoned area with a sleeper berth being used for sleeping or resting. A gasoline bus loading or unloading passengers may idle for 15 consecutive minutes in a 60-minute period."

The Borough of River Vale hosts a Farmer's Market and several vendors reside right here in Old Tappan. The Farmer's Market is from June 19 through October 30 on Thursdays from noon to 6 PM. The Farmer's Market is located on River Vale Road at Borough Hall. So why not buy quality products made or grown locally? You can save on gas and help the local economy. It is a win for everyone.

HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE: WHAT CAN YOU DO TO AVOID MEDICINES? By Sherrita Bhagan-Bruno, MD, FACC

•Lose weight. Weight loss helps lower blood pressure, even in people whose weight is normal. Every 20 pounds lost may reduce systolic blood pressure 5 to 20mmHg.

- •Stop smoking. Blood pressure immediately goes down when smokers kick the habit. While tobacco increases blood pressure, nicotine does not, so nicotine replacement therapies can be used to assist in smoking cessation.
- •Drink only in moderation, if at all. More than two drinks for men and one drink for women has been shown to raise blood pressure.
- •Get 30 minutes of aerobic activity daily. Physical activity, with or without weight loss, reduces high blood pressure.
- •Restrict sodium to less than 2,400 mg per day, and ideally less than 1,500 mg. Do not add salt to your food, even when cooking.
- •Use natural foods instead of processed foods as these are lower in sodium and higher in potassium. Include foods with potassium such as fruits and vegetables.
- •Consider the DASH diet, an eating plan that includes plenty of fruits, vegetables, and low-fat dairy products, along with whole grains, poultry, fish, and nuts.
- •These simple lifestyle changes will help some people control their blood pressure without medications, or with fewer and smaller doses of medications.


