A Message from Mayor Polce



In the fifteen years that I have been privileged to serve as your Mayor, these last several years have presented extraordinary fiscal challenges, yet nothing like what I believe is going to occur over the next few years. With an obvious deflationary death spiral that is impacting us not only locally, but globally, local and state governments will be significantly challenged to craft concrete, fiscally prudent solutions to the lack of revenues and increasing fixed expenses that they will be confronted with. Notwithstanding the foregoing, I can state with total conviction that the Borough of Old Tappan, from a municipal standpoint, is stronger and better positioned than most because of our inherent fiscal discipline, strategic planning and the full faith and support of our residents during this time period. We continue to utilize our corporate model to determine the financial needs of our borough while producing a budget that supplies the services we as

a community need while maintaining a fiscally sound approach to budgeting that is both responsible, and conservative.

The borough portion of your budget is 15% of the overall budget and therefore only 15 cents on the dollar. The school budgets are over 72% of the overall budget, and quite frankly, as we move forward over the next three to five years, this is the component of your budget that truly requires a higher level degree of oversight, and scrutiny. This is not an indictment on our board of education members who do a phenomenal job, both at the local and regional high school level. But rather it is sounding a cautionary warning to all residents that the time for "spending whatever it takes to make sure our kids get the best education possible," may need to be shown through a different prism as there just may not be enough money to pay for things down the road.

Fortunately, Old Tappan enjoys one of the lowest levels of debt service in all of the surrounding communities. In these difficult times, the Council has dug in and committed to reducing debt in a substantive way, particularly last year when we refinanced our debt and shortened our bond maturity table. Although this increased our annual outlay due to the shortened term, we took advantage of lower rates while looking to further reduce our overall indebtedness in a shorter period of years. By shortening the term and lowering our interest expense, we increased our principal payments thereby accelerating the future retirement of debt. This move was strategic and made possible due to the council's financial foresight.

As you know, we continue to support the agencies of the Borough such as Police, Fire, DPW, Ambulance Corp, Library, Recreation,

Senior Programs and administrative agencies of the Borough doing our best to support the expense requirements and the equipment necessary to do their jobs while serving our residents. Each and every one of our employees and volunteers have bought into the notion that if we can do something to save one dollar, let's see if we can save another 50 cents, while still providing best in class services. It may not look like much, but in the overall structure, pennies do add up to dollars.

As some of you may or may not know, I have decided not to run for a fifth four year term this year feeling that the time has come for a new face, with new ideas and



PRIMARY ELECTION: Tuesday, June 2nd 6am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the Primary Election is Tue., May 12th. The Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., May 12th until 9pm

GENERAL ELECTION: Tuesday, Nov. 3rd 6:am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the General Election is Tue., October 13th. Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., Oct. 13th until 9 pm.

The Bergen County Board of Elections issues voter Registration Cards.

If you are going to be out of town on Election Day, you may pick up an absentee ballot application at the Borough Clerk's Office. The <u>County Clerk</u> must receive applications by mail no later than 7 days prior to Election Day. <u>After the 7 day deadline all applications must be hand delivered to the County Clerk no later then 3pm the day before the election</u>.

Sewer flow fee due 3/1/15. There is a 10 day grace period until 3/10/15. Bills were mailed in the beginning of February for both payment periods 3/1 and 9/1. Both periods may be paid at one time. Separate bills will be issued later in the year for those homeowners who have an annual Special Assessment bill for sewer installation.

Property Taxes are due 5/1/15. There is a 10 day grace period extended to 5/11/15 since the 10th lands on a Sunday.

The Old Tappan Police Department wishes all the best to our residents for a Happy and Healthy 2015. While we have not experienced the significant snowfall for the beginning of this winter season that we saw this time last year, our resident's assistance regarding snow removal is still important and greatly appreciated. Police, Fire and Ambulance personnel

look for swift and safe access to homes and properties in the event of an emergency. Clearing driveways and sidewalks of snow, ice and other debris enhance our ability to help residents in their time of need.

The OTPD would like to remind all motorists to exercise caution in and around the area of our schools especially during the time of opening, and the dismissal of students. Please be aware of the presence of our School Crossing Guards and their very important role for keeping the students safe. Residents are reminded that Borough Ordinance 242-2D prohibiting overnight parking from 2 am to 6 am is in effect from November 15th to April 1st.

Prom and Graduation time of year is not that far away. Parents and residents are reminded that underage drinking is against the law. State Law and Borough Ordinance prohibit underage alcohol consumption on public and private property. Liability issues should be seriously considered by property owners and residents with regard to allowing the underage consumption of alcoholic beverages within their homes.

The OTPD has continued to distribute yellow Courtesy Security Awareness cards to select homes. While on patrol in your neighborhood, an Officer may have noticed a condition that might pose a threat to your safety and property. Persons with unlawful intent often look for inviting conditions in selecting a target of opportunity for unlawful purposes. OTPD Officers may provide this card should they observe a condition of this nature. Residents are reminded to contact the OTPD as soon as possible when observing suspicious persons or activity. If you see something, say something. The OTPD would prefer to check a report of this nature immediately and find out it was nothing, than receive the report a day or two later and find it was indeed very important. Please join with us in making Old Tappan a safer and secure place to live.

The Old Tappan DPW yard will accept and recycle unwanted electronics which contain significant amount of toxic and precious metals. Look for the storage box in the rear of the yard.

Warmer weather is upon us, and with the nicer weather we will all begin to do more outdoor household activities such as yard work, cleaning, painting, etc., many of the products we use for these activities are flammable and you need to be aware that all fuels, solvents, cleaning agents, thinners, adhesives, paints, and other raw materials – can ignite or explode if stored improperly. The vapors can easily ignite from high temperatures and a weak ignition source, even a spark of static electricity. Never store flammable liquids near a heating source but, ideally, outside the home in a cool ventilated area, and in approved containers. Naturally, with the nicer weather comes barbequing. Although they are typically pretty safe we actually get a fair amount of calls for barbeque fires, and sometimes house fires start because of improperly placed barbeques. To insure that doesn't happen, here are some suggestions; as part of regular maintenance, clean and degrease all removable parts to avoid flare ups or grease fires (inside and out) with soapy water and allow to dry thoroughly before trying to ignite or use the barbeque. Turn the gas off and spray the connections with soapy water to check for potential leaks; watch if bubbles form when you re-open the gas. Use barbecues away from your home, deck rails, tablecloths, and tree limbs. Always use barbecues outdoors, never indoors (including garages).

Installed on the roofs of Borough Hall, the fire house and the police department in 2010, solar panels have been steadily producing a surplus of sustainable energy. As of December 31, 2014, the panels have produced enough clean-green power with the energy equivalency of 28,000 gallons of gasoline and 350,000 Kilowatts. In the process, they have saved over 6,000 trees and reduced the Borough's carbon footprint by 250 tons. They also produced economically with the sale of solar renewable energy certificates. IT'S IMPORTANT TO GET THE FLU SHOT THIS

YEAR AND EVERY YEAR... Although half of the H3N2 influenza strain that is circulating this year is not sensitive to the vaccine, this is not a reason to avoid receiving the flu shot, as it may still confer partial protection. If vaccinated individuals do contract the new strain, they may not



become as ill as those who did not receive the vaccine at all. The flu vaccine protects against three distinct strains of influenza and is highly effective against two of them. Thus, those who have not had a flu shot should speak to their health care provider about receiving one, and if they develop symptoms of the flu, they should exercise good personal hygiene — cover mouth and nose for coughs and sneezes, avoid close personal contact, wash hands scrupulously — and seek medical attention.

Great News for Baseball and Softball in Old Tappan...The Old Tappan Recreation Commission continues to be focused on making sure that our

volunteer-run sports organizations in town continue to provide quality programs that offer an enjoyable format for all youngsters in Old Tappan, while also offering a higher level of competitive sport for those who want to participate at a higher level. Most of the sports programs run a "recreation" level program which is all inclusive and provides instruction and education about the game. In addition, there is typically a "travel" program which provides a higher level of competition playing in more competitive leagues for those who want a more challenging sports environment. Recently, some changes have taken place in Old Tappan concerning baseball and softball. Historically, there was one board to handle both baseball and softball. The Rec Commission had made the decision to create two separate boards, one for Baseball and one for Softball. The intent is to make sure that the Board for Baseball is focusing 100% on

baseball and building the best possible baseball program, and that the Board for Softball is focusing 100% on softball and building the best possible softball program. The volunteers on these new boards don't need to split their energy between two sports, they can just focus on one.

As a result, the Recreation Commission reached out to the public to seek additional volunteers through mass emails and a public meeting. Two boards were assembled, comprised of a few existing members of the prior board plus the addition of a good number of new volunteer members. Those boards are now well underway with their work. Some of the exciting topics being addressed over the winter months are improving the recreation programs by introducing professional training and clinics, the use of indoor facilities to get a jump on the season, and migrating to a 4 town travel program to keep the numbers up and remain competitive in an increasingly competitive sporting landscape. The 4 town travel program would be similar to the Northern Valley Soccer Club, which comingles players from the 4 NVOT towns, and in turn feeds the high school better prepared athletes for athletic competition.

So whether your child is playing baseball or softball, please be sure to participate in the town programs that Old Tappan has to offer. Your child can play Recreational only, or both Recreation and Travel. With these latest changes and the dedication of the newly formed separate boards, we are trying to insure that the programs remain enjoyable, educational, relatively competitive, and a good platform for healthy competition for years to come.


