

PRIMARY ELECTION: Tuesday, June 7th 6am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the Primary Election is Tue., May 17th. The Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., May 17th until 9pm

GENERAL ELECTION: Tuesday, Nov. 8th 6:am - 8pm

Last day to register to vote in the General Election is Tue., October 18th. Municipal Clerk's office will remain open on Tue., Oct. 18th until 9 pm.

The Bergen County Board of Elections issues voter Registration Cards.

If you are going to be out of town on Election Day, you may pick up an absentee ballot application at the Borough Clerk's Office. The <u>County Clerk</u> must receive applications by mail no later than 7 days prior to Election Day. <u>After the 7 day deadline all applications must be hand delivered to the County Clerk no later then 3pm the day before the election</u>.

Sewer flow fee due 9/1/16. There is a 10 day grace period until 9/12/16 since the 10th is on a Saturday. Bills were mailed in the beginning of February for both payment periods 3/1 and 9/1.

Property Taxes are due 5/1/16. There is a 10 day grace period extended to 5/10/16.

Do we have your correct mailing address: Many tax bills as well as other important notices from the Tax Collector are returned by the Post Office as undeliverable. Property owners often neglect advising our office that their mailing address has changed. Please help us to keep our records up to date. Requests to change mailing address must be submitted in writing. Please look for the form on the www.borougholdtappan.net.

Online bill pay from your bank: Please be aware payments that you initiate with your own bank through online bill pay should be scheduled in advance of any due date to allow a sufficient number of mailing days for the Borough to receive, process and apply the payment to your account. Payments from online bill pay are sent through the mail. We do not accept electronic payment for taxes. All payments must be received by 4PM on the 10th day of the grace period. The Borough is not responsible for late payments due to delays in mail service or bank processing.

An alternative to online bill pay is the **Direct Withdrawal ACH bank draft program** we have in place for both taxes and sewer flow fees. Please check our website for application forms and details or come in person to get an application.

Homestead Benefit Program: Homeowners - The filing deadline for 2013 Homestead Benefit Applications was December 31, 2015. The NJ Division of Taxation anticipate homestead benefit payments will appear on May 2016 property tax bills. Your tax collector will issue you a property tax bill or advice copy reflecting the amount of your benefit

You must meet ALL of the following requirements:

You were age 65 or older as of December 31, 2014, or, if under age 65, you were actually receiving Federal Social Security disability benefit payments on or before December 31, 2014, and December 31, 2015;

 You have lived in New Jersey continuously since December 31, 2004, or earlier, as either a homeowner or a renter;

• You have owned and lived in your home (or have leased a site in a mobile home park for a manufactured or mobile home that you own) since December 31, 2011, or earlier;

• You paid the full amount of the 2014 property taxes due on your home by June 1, 2015, and paid the 2015 property taxes by June 1, 2016;

and

- Your total annual income for 2014 did not exceed \$85,553* and for 2015 did not exceed \$87,007.* NOTE: With very few exceptions, all income received during the year must be taken into account to determine eligibility (including social security, pension income, etc.)
- * Eligibility requirements, including income limits, and benefits available under this program may be changed by the State Budget. Any changes to the 2015 eligibility requirements will not be finalized until the completion of the State Budget that must be adopted by July 1, 2016.

A Message from the Department of public works...

BRANCH CHIPPING

The DPW will begin chipping branches that residents have trimmed from their trees on April 13th (if you hire someone to do trimming they are responsible to dispose of the debris). We will do the west side of town (Central Ave. to River Vale) On the 1st & 3rd Wednesdays, and the east side of town (Central Ave. to the state line including Central) on the 2nd & 4th Wednesdays, weather permitting.

You must call 201-664-4438 to advise the DPW that you have put branches out. Please stack branches at the curb with the cut ends facing out, maximum 4 inch diameter, do not place them in the street and do not block the sidewalk. If you have a sidewalk in front of your house you may place them behind the sidewalk.

WOOD MULCH & LEAF COMPOST

The department will begin accepting orders for wood mulch and leaf compost on April 18th (forms available at the Borough Hall) and deliveries will begin after May 1st. Please be reminded that this is a courtesy service and other priorities take precedence.

RECYCLING CENTER

The recycling center located at the Public Works Garage on Russell Avenue is open Monday thru Friday, 7:00 am until 3:00 pm, and from 9:00 am until 1:00 pm on Saturdays (except holidays). Please bring only those items designated for recycling and place them in the appropriate designated container, please do not place plastic bags in with your items. Did you know......? Old Tappan is now completely smoke-free. Last September, the Mayor & Council supported an Environmental Commission initiative and by-ordinance established Old Tappan as completely smoke-free. Smoking is now prohibited on all Borough-owned properties. The Borough now joins over 250 NJ municipalities—41 in Bergen County--in going smoke-free. Breathe easy OT.

Remember those Solar Panels...? Installed on the roofs of Borough Hall, the fire house and the police department in 2010, solar panels have been steadily producing a surplus of sustainable energy. As of December 31, 2014, the panels have produced enough clean-green power with the energy equivalency of 28,000 gallons of gasoline and 350,000 Kilowatts. In the process, they have saved over 6,000 trees and reduced the Borough's carbon footprint by 250 tons. They also produced economically with the sale of solar renewable energy certificates. 



BOARD OF HEALTH PROVIDES INFORMATION ON ZIKA

In the past few months, there has been much publicity about Zika appearing in the news. While the situation regarding Zika illness is evolving, there are some things we know for sure.

Zika is a viral infection that is spread by the bite of an infected mosquito. The mosquito that transmits Zika is called Aedes aegypti. It is the same mosquito that transmits the virus for Dengue fever and Chiungunya. Outbreaks typically occur in tropical Africa and southeast Asia. In May 2015, Brazil reported the first outbreak of Zika in the Americas. Zika is now present in tropical areas. Locally transmitted cases of Zika have not been identified in the United States, although

the potential for local transmission exists as Aedes mosquitoes are present in many states. In late December, the New Jersey Department of Health identified New Jersey's first laboratory-confirmed case of Zika in a Bergen County woman who was exposed while in Columbia.

The most common symptoms of Zika virus disease are fever, rash, joint pain, and conjunctivitis (red eyes). The illness is usually mild with symptoms lasting from several days to a week. Severe disease requiring hospitalization is uncommon. The CDC has issued a travel alert for people traveling to regions and certain countries where Zika virus transmission is ongoing. Until more is known and out of an abundance of caution, the CDC recommends special precautions for pregnant women and women trying to become pregnant.

With the warmer weather coming, the Board of Health strongly advises that it is important to protect yourself, your family, and community from mosquitoes. This includes:

- Eliminating standing water in and around your home. **Once a week** empty and scrub, turn over, cover, or throw out items that hold water, such as tires, buckets, planters, toys, pools, birdbaths, flowerpots, or trash containers.
- Tightly cover storage containers (buckets, cisterns, rain barrels) so that mosquitoes cannot get inside to lay eggs.
- For containers without lids, use wire mesh with holes smaller than an adult mosquito.
- If you have a septic tank, repair cracks or gaps and cover open vent or plumbing pipes.
- Keep mosquitoes out of your home by using screens on windows and doors, repair holes in screens and use air conditioning when available.
- Prevent mosquito bites by using an Environmental Protection Agency (EPA)-registered insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin or IR3535. **Always** use as directed. If you are also using sunscreen, apply sunscreen first and insect repellent second.
- Cover exposed skin by wearing long-sleeved shirts and long pants.
- Use permethrin-treated clothing and gear (such as boots, pants, socks and tents). You can purchase pre-treated clothing and gear or treat them yourself. If treating items yourself, follow the product instructions carefully.

Thus far the winter season has not been too bad, but everyone still anxiously waits for spring to get started and the cold weather to fade. There are a few more weeks of winter remaining and resident's assistance regarding snow removal is very much appreciated by all of your emergency services. Clearing

driveways and sidewalks of snow, ice and other debris enhance our ability to help residents in their time of need. Also, please remember to remove snow and ice from all vehicles before traveling upon the roadways. The OTPD would like to remind all motorists to exercise caution in and around the area of our schools especially during the time of opening, and the dismissal of students. Please be aware of the presence of our School Crossing Guards and their very important role for keeping students safe.

Daylight savings time provides the opportunity for longer periods outside, and various types of outdoor activities begin to take place. The Old Tappan business districts, school fields, parks and recreational facilities become busy places. The OTPD would like to remind everyone using and traveling in the area of these facilities to exercise caution and be safe. Please be aware of pedestrians walking in parking lots and crossing the streets leading to these business and recreational areas. Drivers are encouraged to reduce their speed in and around the properties used for these purposes. Complaints of speeding vehicles and distracted driving appear to be the most frequent violations reported around the residential streets of our community. In many instances, the drivers are our own neighbors. Kindly make every effort to comply with the 25MPH speed limit and parking regulations in all residential areas, and reduce your speed especially near our schools, and recreational areas.

Residents are reminded that Borough Ordinance 242-2D prohibiting overnight parking from 2 am to 6 am is not in effect from April 1st to November 15th and overnight parking on residential streets is permitted unless otherwise posted.

The Prom and Graduation time of year is rapidly approaching. Parents and residents are reminded that underage drinking is against the law. State Law and Borough Ordinance prohibit underage alcohol consumption on public and private property. Liability issues should be seriously considered by property owners and residents with regard to allowing the underage consumption of alcoholic beverages within their homes. Also, it is unlawful in the State of New Jersey to use or possess fireworks without being licensed to do so. The Old Tappan Police Department wishes all residents to have a safe and healthy summer, and encourages our residents to be alert with regard to the safety of our community. Warmer weather is upon us, and with the nicer weather we will all begin to do more outdoor household activities such as yard work, cleaning, painting, etc., many of the products we use for these activities are flammable and you need to be aware that all fuels, solvents, cleaning agents, thinners, adhesives, paints, and other raw materials – can ignite or explode if stored improperly. The vapors can easily ignite from high temperatures or a weak ignition source, even a spark of static electricity. Never store flammable liquids near a heating source or inside a home but, instead outside or in a shed in a cooler ventilated area, and in approved containers.

Naturally, with the nicer weather comes barbequing. Although they are typically pretty safe we actually get a fair amount of calls for barbeque fires, and sometimes house fires start because of improperly placed barbeques. To insure that doesn't happen, here are some suggestions; as part of regular maintenance, clean and degrease all removable parts to avoid flare ups or grease fires (inside and out) with soapy water and allow to dry thoroughly before trying to ignite or use the barbeque. When you first start your grill up spray the tubing and connections with soapy water to check for potential leaks; watch if bubbles form when you open the gas shutoff or burner valves, if they do turn the gas off and have the fittings or lines tightened or repaired before using the grill again.

If you are "old school" and prefer to use an open charcoal or a wood grill please be especially careful while lighting, cooking and after using the grill regarding its location near structures and flammable surfaces as the open flame, embers or coals could cause a fire to start easier than a modern covered gas grill. Always use barbecues away from your home, deck rails, tablecloths, and tree limbs. Always use barbecues outdoors, never indoors (including garages).

Please remember to check or change the batteries in your smoke and CO detectors and replace defective or non-working units with the new and improved units now available.

UPDATE... The New Jersey State Supreme Court had determined that every community has a responsibility to provide an opportunity to develop affordable housing.

Old Tappan has aggressively and proactively identified its fair share to the State Council on Affordable Housing. We have met our Prior Round obligations and are currently engaged in Third Round discussions as the original Third Round agreements throughout the State have been discarded by the courts and are being revisited at this time. You may have seen stories in the paper and the entire process is very much up in the air. The Borough believes it has met, and in fact exceeded its requirements, despite the developed nature of Old Tappan and the environmental features we have throughout the Borough

Working together to protect the Borough while addressing our constitutional obligation are the Mayor and Council, Planning Board, Borough Attorney, and Borough Planner, Burgis Associates. Old Tappan has filed documents with the court, including its Third Round Housing Plan, explaining the position of the Borough and identifying its COAH requirement, which is based on the realistic development potential of the Borough.

Under current rules our application is filed with the Superior Court. The Judge assigned to hear our plan and other plans from our area is Judge Menalaos Toskos of the Superior Court of the State of New Jersey. Judge Toskos has assigned a Master to act on behalf of the courts to collect information and advise the Court. The Master is Francis Banisch III, a member of the American Institute of Certified Planners and well respected within the planning profession. The Borough filed with Judge Toskos and met with Mr. Banisch. During his tour of the Borough, Mr. Banisch was able to see firsthand the available land and how Old Tappan has addressed its Prior Round obligations. It was a very instructive and interesting day.

COAH will not be going away. Old Tappan is confident it is doing all it should be to meet the state's mandate regarding affordable housing. Old Tappan is also investigating ways to meet future needs in a way that will impact the Borough in as positive a direction as it can, providing meaningful housing opportunities, serving those who need it most, developing housing that would make every resident proud of the participation in developing housing for those who need it most.

COAH is very fluid at this time. We will do our best to keep you advised as we move forward.




